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GROUP AGREEMENTS

GROUP RESPONSIBILITIES

- I. Each member is responsible for the following:
 - a. Coordinating with each other about our individual schedules, needs, deficiencies, and anything else that may interfere with the project in any aspect.
 - b. Attending all meetings
 - i. If a member has an excused reason why a meeting cannot be made, then the meeting can be rescheduled.
 - ii. If a meeting is missed by a member, that member is responsible for all of the material covered during the meeting.
 - c. Meeting deadlines
 - i. All deadlines are expected to be met on-time.
 - ii. If a deadline is set for a part of a project, and the deadline is expected to be missed, the member(s) responsible for that part of the project will have to let all other members know that the project will not meet the deadline, reasoning as to why, and create a new deadline that will not inconvenience the rest of the group.
 - d. Quality of one's own work
 - i. A group member is responsible for their own mathematical calculations, research, etc.

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OTHER STIPULATIONS

- I. Disagreements within the group
 - a. In the event of a disagreement between two group members, the third remaining group member will act as an unbiased arbiter over the disagreement and decide on the best course of action.
 - i. If the third member of the group is biased, defer to I-b.
 - b. In the event of a disagreement between all three group members, the entire group will defer to either Dr. Hollis or Dr. Amin for advice in the situation.
- II. A group member's withdrawal from the project
 - a. If a group member needs to withdraw from the project, it is his responsibility to let the rest of the group know immediately and reasoning as to why so that proactive action can be taken to smooth the transition.
 - b. The group member leaving is also responsible for delivering all of the project material he was responsible for in the best condition possible before leaving.
 - c. If any group member, for whatever circumstance, has to withdraw from the project, then the remaining two group members will spilt his burden evenly among them based upon their individual skill sets and current tasks.
 - i. A new code of conduct will be drafted to outline the current and new responsibilities the remaining members will carry.
